Educational Initiatives

Connecting Generations through Mentoring

We partnered with Parkrose Middle School to offer an online mentoring program where nearly 20 mentors support over 20 students to develop proficiency in English. Students received an average of 50+ hours of support. Because of our success, we are helping to launch a program in Bend.

Bringing People Together across Differences

Accelerating Transitions to Electric Vehicles

SAGE's EVs for All team offers education, outreach, electric vehicle charging stations and electric vehicles to older adults with the goal of increasing awareness and use of electric vehicles. Building a Brighter Climate Future

Our Vision 2030 team offers education for middle and high school students about the City of Portland's climate goal to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 50 percent from 1990 levels by the year 2030. This year, we reached over 1,500 students and we hosted two large climate solutions fairs so students could learn about solutions and workforce opportunities through hands-on exhibits.
